








My-Kap™ Instructions

Thank you for purchasing My-Kap™ Kap. Each Kap is made out of durable plastic and should last many years and thousands of brews. For additional Kaps, quantity pricing, and Kaps in color, please go to <http://www.my-kap.com>.

#	Picture	Description
1		Start with one of your favorite K-Cup coffees or teas and brew yourself a cup.
2		When you are done brewing you now have a K-Cup that has been punctured in the top and the bottom of the cup.
3		Peel the tin foil off of the K-Cup.
4		Wash the coffee or tea grinds out of the K-Cup. ¹
5		Fill your K-Cup with your favorite coffee or tea. Make sure your coffee grind is “fine”. Fill the K-Cup high or low depending on the strength of coffee you desire.
6		Insert the Kap on the inside top of the K-Cup snugly and brew! ²
7		When you are done, enjoy your brew, remove the K-Cup and Kap (using the removal tool supplied) and start over with step 4.

¹ Let it dry before re-loading it with coffee or tea if you are not going to brew right away. Cleanliness of the K-Cup and My-Kap is your responsibility.

² Wash your Kap with warm soapy water before initial use and dry thoroughly. If this is the first time you have used the Kap in a K-Cup it might be tight and sit high. The K-Cup expands and the Kap fits lower in the cup after the first use.

Questions and Answers:

Q: How many times can I re-use my K-Cup?

A: As many times as you are comfortable with. I have used mine 10-20 times. The paper filter in these cups is very durable. Wash it out every time and you will get many uses out of a K-Cup.

Q: How many times can I re-use the Kap?

A: Forever. This Kap is made of extremely strong plastic. Keep it clean and re-use it forever.

Q: How much coffee should I put in the cup?

A: 2 (maybe 3) teaspoons are about right depending on your taste. Make sure you use a fine grind.

Q: Should I air dry the K-Cup before filling?

A: If you are going to use it right away, go ahead and clean it, fill it up, and use it. If you are going to make the K-Cup for use later, let the K-Cup air dry before filling. In this case it is also good to have a number of Kap's on hand so you can make a bunch at a time.

Q: Sometimes the brew seems to overflow/leak from the top of the K-Cup?

A: This might happen for a few reasons. First it might be because the Kap is not snugly fitted into the K-Cup. Gently push and make sure it is a firm fit. Also, you may need to hold the lever down to force a good pressure seal on the K-Cup. Second, the K-Cup might be over filled with coffee or tea. Overfilling will cause the K-Cup pressure to build up to high and flow out the top. This also happens with the Keurig Reusable K-Cup.

Q: Does it hurt to have lots of holes in the bottom of the K-Cup?

A: I generally try to avoid making new holes by aligning the K-Cup each time I reuse it. It is easy to do. However, if you do puncture additional holes it will not matter. It is just a few more holes for the coffee to flow out of. If you look at the filter closely you will see that it does not touch the bottom of the cup, so by the time the fluid hits the bottom of the cup it just needs somewhere to go. The extra holes just help. It will not affect the strength of the brew.
